

ALPHABET BOXES—CHARACTERS IN *JANE EYRE*

As is the case with all strategies, it is important to take processing to deeper levels. To achieve this, the students might, for example, be asked to use their alphabet boxes as concept bundles and, in writing, make meaningful connections between content, vocabulary, or characters using boxes or letters that the teacher designate.
