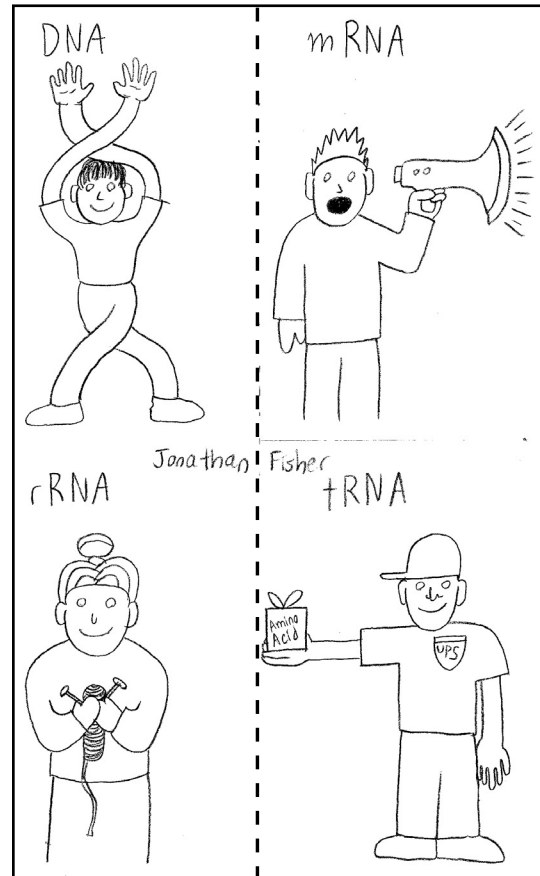


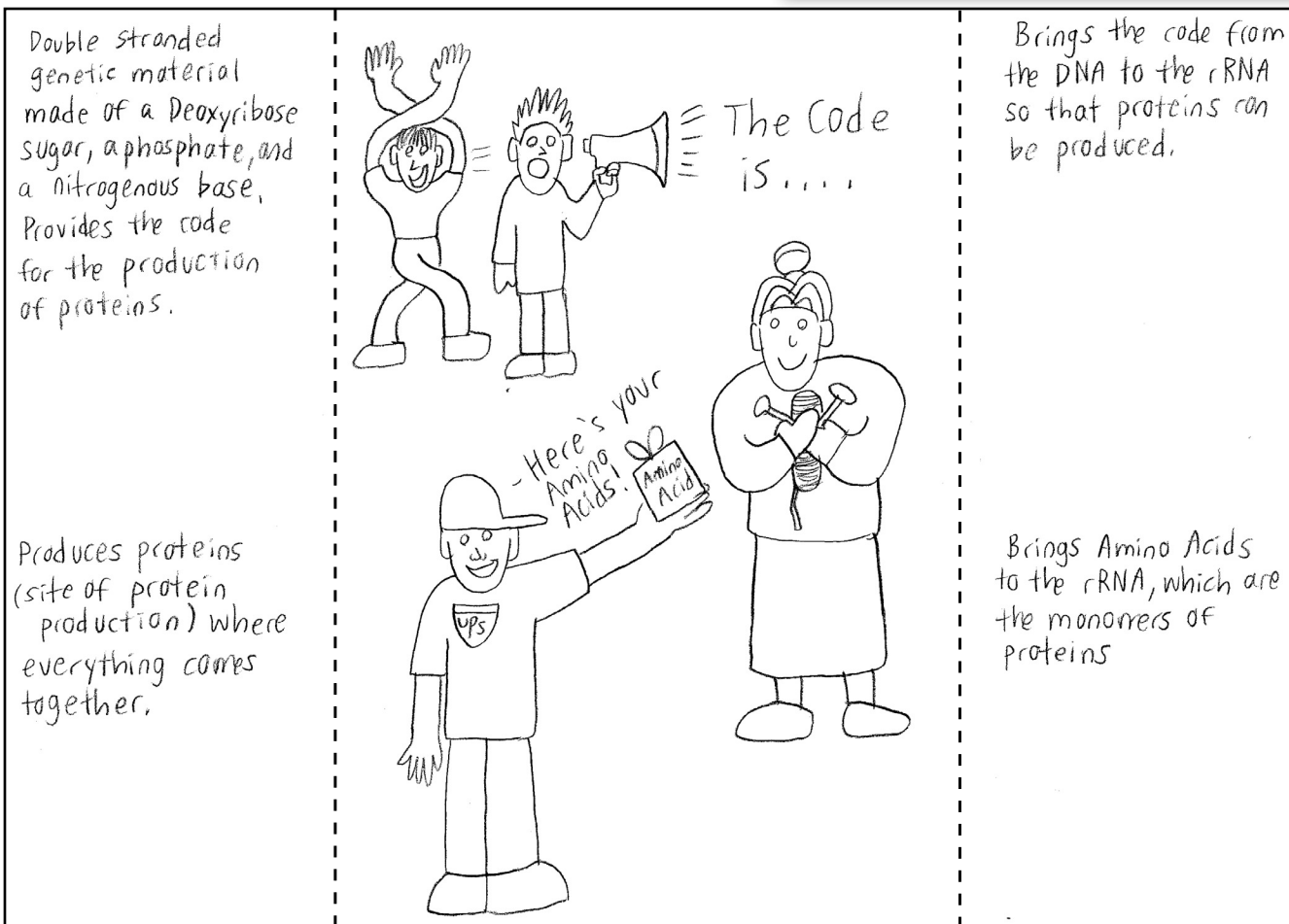
# CARTOON CONVERSATIONS

Cartoon Conversations are great ways to get students to think deeper while using some talents they normally don't get to exhibit in science class. The steps are easy but the thinking and probing can be challenging.

To get started: (1) Make a shutter fold. (2) choose 2—4 'topics' that will converse—people, events, processes, concepts (3) Make front flaps. Draw icons for the 'topics.' (4) List critical attributes on inside flaps.
